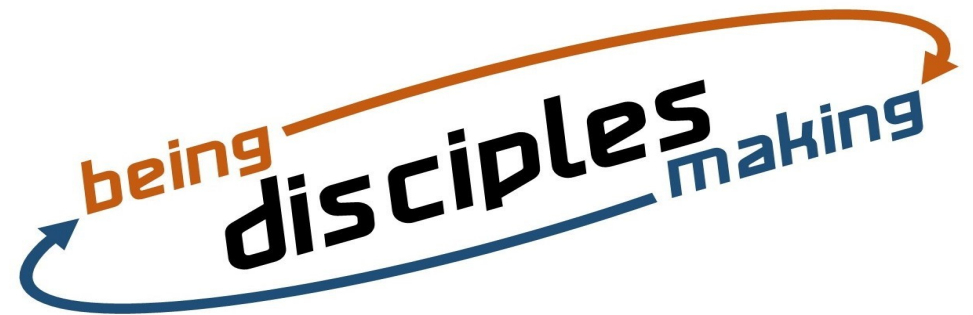

Food for Thought From our Priest in Charge Archdeacon May

I don't know about you but sometimes I struggle to stay in a positive frame of mind.

Rather than think the best of people at times it's seems easy to slip into a negative frame of mind and become critical and quite judgemental.

It's easy to be influenced by who shouts the loudest about refugees, immigrants to our country, the unemployed, child poverty. The list could go on.

For us who have chosen for Jesus and to live the Jesus way one of the stumbling blocks is that we are called to live in the world but not be of the world. That's a lot more difficult to do than we might think.

My experience is that unless I touch base with my worshipping family and Jesus my shepherd and mentor regularly I can be pretty easily influenced by the messages of the world around me. I'm guessing it's probably the same for all of us. Added to that I have the messages that influenced me from my upbringing, both positive and negative , that are more engrained than I like to think.

So when I read in the Gospel where Matthew tells us that " When he (Jesus) looked over the crowds, his heart broke. So confused and aimless they were, like sheep with no shepherd" that set me thinking.

These were his own people but when Jesus and the Jewish Leaders look at them gathered there they saw different things. One sees their faults the other sees who they were as children of God.

How we live in community speaks volumes about who we are in relation to Jesus.

What do people see in you? I don't mean our friends. I'm talking about people whose lives we touch daily maybe just in passing. The person who serves us our coffee, the checkout operator, our neighbours.

In what frame do we place people we don't know? What value do they have for us? And come to think of it, in what frame do we place people who don't share our beliefs and values?
